• Foundation Degree in Early Years

For those who are currently working or volunteering in an early years or reception class setting and want to gain a qualification that will help professional progression. You can "learn as you earn" by combining workplace learning with part-time study.

Why choose this course

This course is recognised as a 'full and relevant' qualification by the Department for Education, valued by employers.

Once you complete the course you will have 240 academic credits.

You will be assessed through a variety of assignments. There are no written exams.

Careers and progression

You will be supported in your second year of the Foundation Degree to progress onto one of Kingston's one year BA (Top Up) courses. Upon successful completion of the third year, you will achieve an honours degree (360 credits).

Our Foundation Degree in Early Years with Early Years Educator provides an excellent opportunity for individuals who do not hold Early Years Educator status to embark on a rewarding educational journey. 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What will you study?

The Foundation Degree in Early Years enables you to combine academic study with learning at your place of work.

The course covers a wide range of critical and contemporary issues in the field of Early Years education. It explores the voice of the child, international perspectives, child protection, pedagogical approaches, communication theories and multi-professional practice.

You will reflect on theoretical and practice-based knowledge to support approaches to working with children from birth to five, with an appreciation of ages up to eight.

If you do not already hold Early Years Educator Status from your Level 3 qualification, we offer the Early Years (with Early Years Educator) pathway which is classified as a 'full and relevant' qualification by the Department for Education.

Once you complete this course, you can top-up your qualification to a full BA (Hons) degree, through one year's study at Kingston.
